Trimming the trees is an important part of the Emergency Management Plans in the easements we share with the utilities. This effort helps to prevent down lines during high wind events (i.e. hurricanes) or other cold weather events. The City has been working with Brazoria County to accomplish several projects. The retention pond was a high priority item since it was recently discovered there was not a flapper installed preventing water from Mustang Bayou from backfilling the pond. 
COVID GRANT WATER TANK REPAIRS

The City of Hillcrest has been using the COVID Grant funds to address the pitting found within the hydropneumatics tanks. After following the federal grant process, the City Council accepted the project proposal from the contractor who met the requirements. John Patterson and Kendal McGilvray have been working with the contractor to ensure he meets his contract agreements. They have also been on site during their personal time to check on the progress of the project too. A huge thank you for helping to keep this project on track and to minimize the impact to the community!



COVID GRANT WATER TANK REPAIRS – CONT.

Another item we used the COVID grant funds were to add turning valves to the tank that will allow the tank to be isolated while work is being conducted. By isolating the tanks, water can be kept on for the City instead of needing to turn everything off. We are excited about this new addition to our water system!
